

# 2008 Art Classes at Irvington

Using a wide variety of high quality materials students will create projects inspired by nature, imagination, art history, and the art and cultures of countries where the teacher has traveled, lived, and studied. Class size will be limited to 10, allowing for an in-depth, individualized experience.

Classes are ongoing, and some students attend all year while others enroll for just one or a few sessions. Projects are not repeated. Over the course of the year we will draw, paint, collage, sew, construct and create glazed and fired clay pieces.

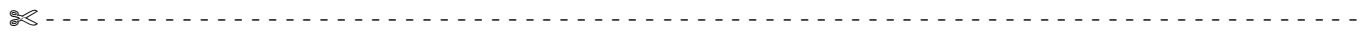
In the Clay Only Class children will learn clay construction and glazing techniques while creating several glazed and fired projects, often based on historical or cultural examples.

Gayle Steinberger, M.A., M.F.A. in art and art history has been Irvington's artist-in-residence for the past 12 years. She has spent time in Mexico, Cuba, Japan, Taiwan, Singapore, India, China, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Burma, Indonesia, Laos, Cambodia, Thailand and Europe.

Gayle will be traveling in Guatemala for several weeks in February, during which time classes will be taught by guest artist Jude Cornwell. Jude has exhibited her work widely and has many years of teaching experience, including being one of the founders of Grace Art Camp where we have worked as colleagues.
